A complete schedule of free events at the Top of the Park will be announced in June, and will be available at the Top of the Park Information Booth, along with Festival posters and T-shirts.

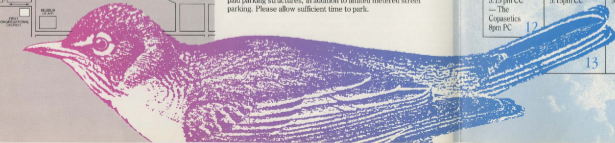
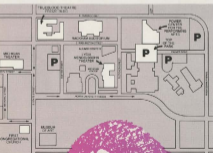

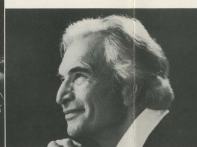
