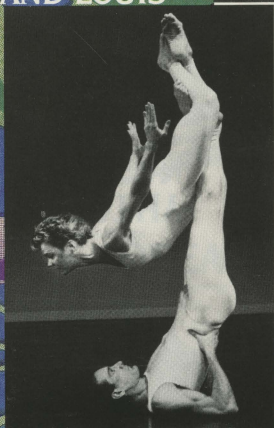

GETTING TO THE FESTIVAL IT'S CLOSER THAN YOU THINK!



From Suburban Detroit — I-696 West to I-275 South to M-14 West to Ann Arbor. Exit Business-23 ("Downtown Ann Arbor"). Follow Main St. to Washington St. Left on Washington which ends at the Power Center.

From Detroit — I-94 West to State St. exit. Follow State St. 4.5 miles to Washington St. Right on Washington.

From Jackson — I-94 East to exit #172 (Jackson Rd.). East on Jackson Rd. which becomes Haron. 2 miles to Fletcher St. Turn right on Fletcher.

From Flint — US-23 South, exit Geddes Rd. going west. Geddes becomes Fuller, which becomes Gies Ave., which ends at the Power Center.

From Lansing — I-96 East to US-23 South. Exit Business-23 ("Downtown Ann Arbor"). Follow Main St. to Washington St. Left on Washington which ends at the Power Center.

From Toledo — US-23 North, exit Geddes Rd. going west. Geddes becomes Fuller, which becomes Glen Ave., which ends at the Power Center.

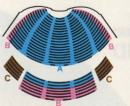

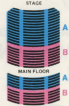
