



From the City

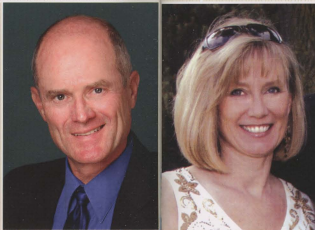
