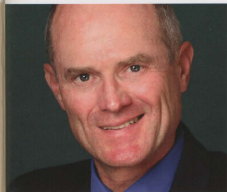
## FROM THE DIRECTOR

Activities Off Site

Coordinated by University Organist Marilyn Mason, the festival's Organ Series includes three distinct classical performances featuring world-renowned musicians. All concerts are presented in the Blanche Anderson Moore Hall in the E.V. Moore Building on North Campus.
